Title I

The No Child Left behind Act (NCLB) of 2001 was signed into law on January 8, 2002 by President Bush.

The Act represents the President's education reform plan and contains the most sweeping changes to the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) since it was enacted in 1965. NCLB changes the federal government's role in K-12 education by focusing on school success as measured by student achievement.

The Act contains the President's four basic education reform principles:

- **stronger accountability for results,**
- **increased flexibility and local control,**
- **expanded options for parents, and**
- **an emphasis on teaching methods that have been proven to work.**

Goals of Title I

- ❖ Provides supplemental educational opportunities through federal funding.
- ❖ Ensure children have fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain high quality education.
- ❖ Reach, at minimum, proficiency on challenging state standards & assessments (reading, mathematics, and readiness).

Targeted Assistance Schools

- ❖ Students are selected through certain eligibility requirements (NJ ASK scores, report card grades, benchmark scores, teacher recommendation)
- ❖ Students exit program using same criteria

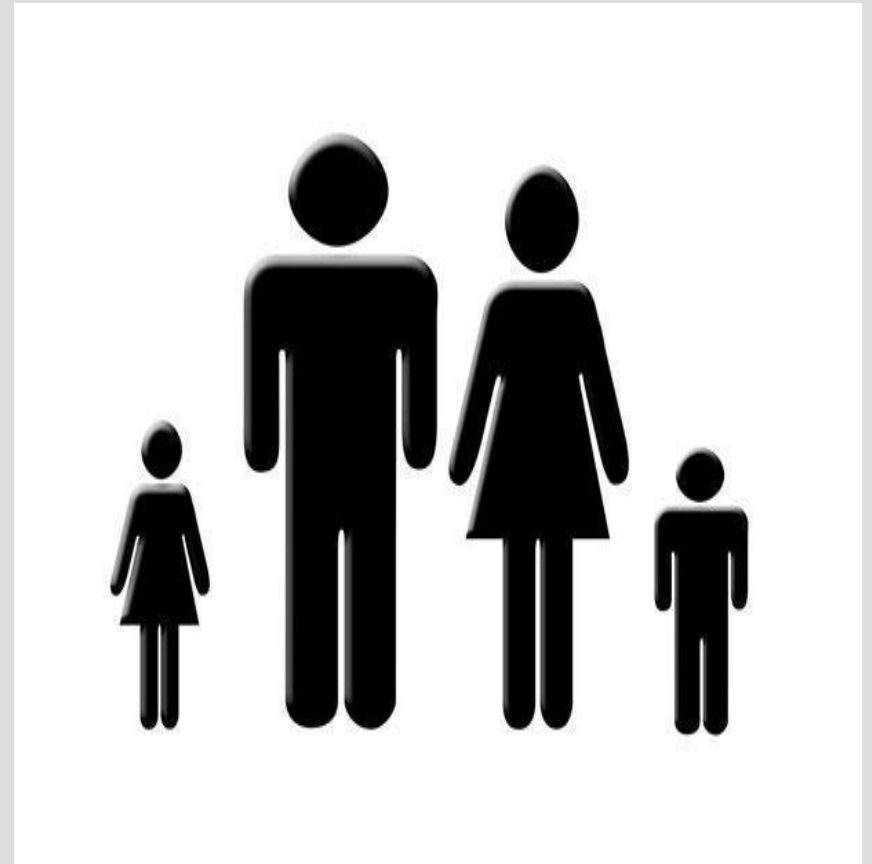
